Scene 1:
At the News Desk

Cory: “Good morning, my name is Cory Caring”

Clint: “and I’m Clint Courteous.”

Cory: “ In our first story we are going to Price Laboratory School to investigate the caring community found there.”

Clint: “That’s right Cory. It has come to our attention that the fourth graders of Price Lab has been studying how to become caring citizens.”

Cory: “We have sent our investigative reporter Ronny Reportwell to the scene. Ronny, what have you found?”

Scene 2:
In the Hallway

Ronny: “Thank you, Cory. Today I am at Price Lab School in Cedar Falls, Iowa investigating a report that this school is a caring community. The question is; What is a caring community?”

Ronny: “Excuse me. I am Ronny Reportwell from KARE TV-4 . Is this a caring community?”

Raeven: “Oh, yes it is.”

Ronny: “How do you know?”

Raeven: “Yeah, we also help each other when someone is hurt.”

Scene 3:
In the Library

Nathan: “It sure is. We are working on a project for social studies. I couldn’t find a book that I needed and Jake helped me find it. It was very kind of him to do that.”

Ronny: (To Jake) “Why were you being kind and caring? Why didn’t you just let Nathan find it himself?”

Jake: “Because we believe that none of us is as smart as all of us. Nathan and I are working on a project together. Part of learning together is being kind and helpful to one another. Also it made me feel good to help him find the book. It was a win-win situation.”

Ronny: (To Nathan) “How did you feel when Jake helped you find the book?”

Nathan: “It made me feel good. Now I know why thinking of others and being caring is important.”

Ronny: “Well, these two are working together and being respectful by caring for each other’s needs. Let’s see what is happening in the lunchroom.”

Scene 4 In the lunchroom

Ronny: “Here we are in the lunchroom with the 4th graders. This group has shown a caring attitude in the hallway and in the library. Let’s see if this is true for the lunchroom also.”

Shesthers: (Alex is looking for a place to sit in the lunchroom) “Hey, Alex come sit here next to me.”

Alex: “Thanks Shesthers I couldn’t find a place to sit. It was nice of you to let me sit here.”

Shesthers: “No problem. We have a caring community. Being caring is sometimes such a little thing. It made me feel good to invite you to sit at our table.”

Ronny: “Excuse me. I am Ronny Reportwell from KARE TV-4 . I noticed that you called your friend over to sit at this table. What was that all about?”

Shesthers: “Well, like I told Alex we have a caring community. Being caring is sometimes such a little thing and easy to do and I felt great about helping her. I know feeling left out is no fun.”

Ronny: (To Alex) “I can tell by the smile on your face that you were really happy that Shesthers invited you to sit with him.”

Alex: “Yes, it was really nice of him to make me feel part of this group.”

Scene 5 In the classroom

(As Ronny enters the classroom the students are working with computers. Marcus is helping another student complete an assignment)

Ronny: “Excuse me. I am Ronny Reportwell from KARE TV-4 . I noticed that you were helping your friend with their assignment. What were you doing?”

Student 7: “Well, Raeven was having a hard time finding the correct location for the webquest that we are working on. I could see that she was getting frustrated, so I just helped her, it’s no big thing.”

Ronny: “Well Cory, here it is again, 4th graders showing a caring attitude toward others. What a wonderful place Price Laboratory School is. Back to you, Cory.”

Scene 6 Back to the Studio

Cory: “Thanks for that enlightening report, Ronny. It is clear that a caring person helps others without thinking of themselves.”

Clint: “That’s right Cory, a caring person treats others the way they want to be treated.”

Cory: “Hey, isn’t that the Golden Rule?”

Clint: “It sure is, Cory.”

Cory: “Wow, the Price Lab students have shown us that using the Golden Rule really builds a positive community. I’m Cory Caring....”

Clint: “And I’m Clint Courtesy, saying.”
